

AGREEMENT N° 316 2016-MINEDU/VMGI-PRONABEC

SPECIFIC AGREEMENT OF INTERNATIONAL INTERINSTITUTIONAL COLLABORATION BETWEEN NATIONAL PROGRAM OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND EDUCATIONAL CREDIT OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION OF PERU AND THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA - UNITED STATES

This document is the Specific Agreement of International Interinstitutional Collaboration between **NATIONAL PROGRAM OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND EDUCATIONAL CREDIT OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION OF PERU**, hereafter PRONABEC, with RUC N° 20546798152, with legal address in Av. Arequipa N° 1935 - Lince - Lima 14, Perú, represented by the Executive Director, Lic. Sergio David Bravo Cucci, identified with DNI N° 09536762, appointed by Ministerial Resolution N° 319-2016-MINEDU and **THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA OBO THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA** hereafter THE ENTITY, with legal address at 660 Parrington Oval, Norman, Oklahoma, USA, represented by the his President, Dr. David L. Boren, who is appropriately authorized to execute this agreement according to Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma Policy 4.10 under the terms and conditions expressed as follows:

FIRST: THE PARTIES

1.1 PRONABEC, is the Executive Unit N° 117 of The Ministry of Education of Peru, who has technical autonomy, administrative, economic, financial and budgetary in charge of the design, planning, managing, monitoring and evaluating of scholarships and educative credits. Its purpose contributing to equal opportunity in higher education insuring the access of low income students with high academic performance guaranteeing, as well as its permanence, culmination and titration.

1.2 PRONABEC subsidizes:

1.2.1. Graduate studies for professionals with high academic performance and insufficient economic resources in Eligible International Higher Educational Institutions and Universities whom must be ranked among the first four hundred (400) at least once in the five years prior to the respective call in the following rankings: QS World University Rankings, Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU), Times Higher Education World University Rankings, and focused on studies related to Peruvian scientific and technological development according to the priority fields stated in **Annex 1**.

1.2.2. Tuition, student fees, study materials, insurance with health, accident, life and repatriation coverage, research work, certification (administrative costs for obtaining the relevant degree or certification), allowance for food, lodging and local transportation; international transport (only at the beginning and end of the academic program), except tuition associated with any Repeated Course(s) as defined in Section 6.1.5.



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1.3. THE ENTITY

1.3.1. The University of Oklahoma was created by the Oklahoma Territorial Legislature in 1890. It is a doctoral degree-granting research university serving the educational, cultural, economic and health care needs of the state, region and nation. The Norman campus serves as home to all of the university's academic programs except health-related fields. Both the Norman and Health Sciences Center colleges offer programs at the Schusterman Center, the site of OU-Tulsa. The OU Health Sciences Center, which is located in Oklahoma City, is one of only four comprehensive academic health centers in the nation with seven professional colleges. OU campuses enroll more than 31,000 students, have more than 2,000 full-time faculty members, and 21 colleges offering 165 majors at the baccalaureate level, 159 majors at the masters level, 80 majors at the doctoral level, 28 majors at the first professional level, and 29 graduate certificates. The university's annual operating budget is more than \$1 billion. The University of Oklahoma is an equal opportunity institution.

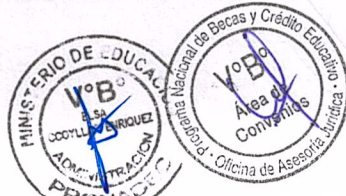
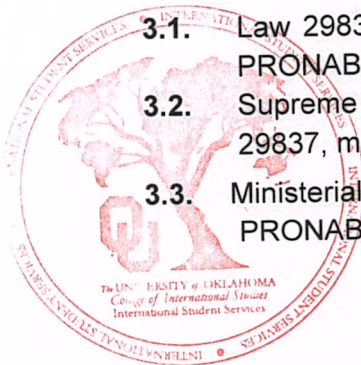

SECOND: BACKGROUND

The Agreement of Interinstitutional Cooperation, between PRONABEC and THE ENTITY, exercises the intention of the parties to strengthen their efforts to increase the offer of graduate scholarships with the objective of boosting the human capital with an adequate training, refinement and research promoting competitiveness and scientific and technology development for Peru.

THIRD: LEGAL FRAMEWORK

- 3.1. Law 29837 creates the National Program of Scholarship and Educative Credit – PRONABEC, modified by Sixth Complementary Provision that modifies Law 30281.
- 3.2. Supreme Decree N° 013-2012-ED approves the Rules and Regulations of the Law 29837, modified by Supreme Decrees N° 008-2013-ED and 001-2015-MINEDU.
- 3.3. Ministerial Resolution N° 0108-2012-MINEDU approves the Operations Manual of PRONABEC, modified by Ministerial Resolution N° 535-2015-MINEDU.



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- 3.4. Ministerial Resolution N° 319-2015-MINEDU, assigns the functions of Pronabec Executive Director.
- 3.5. The University of Oklahoma and its grant of authority to the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma is found in Article 13, Section 8 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma.
- 3.6. University policies that govern graduate students include: Graduate Student Handbook, Graduate Student Bulletin, Handbook specific to any College or Department, Student Code of Rights and Responsibilities, Academic Integrity Policy, and all Board of Regents Policies related to Non-discrimination.

FOURTH: GENERAL OBJECTIVE

The general objective of this agreement is to impulse the efforts of the Ministry of Education of Peru in building advanced human capital through the awarding of scholarships for graduate studies programs in order to promote the scientific, academic, economic, social and cultural development of the country.

FIFTH: SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE

To promote the access of Peruvian students and professionals with excellent academic performance and insufficient economic resources to the graduate programs offered by THE ENTITY through the financing, by PRONABEC, of up to 50 students every year in Master and Doctoral programs related to Science and Technology, subject to available capacity in the participating academic programs.

The length of the Graduate Scholarships is determined by the program of choice according to the parameters of THE ENTITY in relation to the Master and Doctoral programs specified in Annex 1 of this agreement, up to 2 (two) years for Masters and up to 4 (four) years for Doctorates.

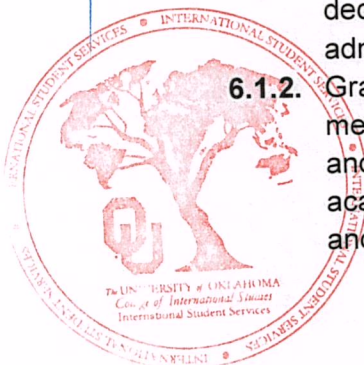
SIXTH: COMMITMENTS OF THE PARTIES

6.1. COMMITMENTS OF THE ENTITY

THE ENTITY assumes the following commitments:

6.1.1. No application or registration fees will be charged to Scholarship awardees for Masters and Doctoral studies. Costs of Peruvian scholarship holders, are stated in Annex 3 of this agreement, and are valid for the year 2016. Annually, at the beginning of every fiscal year, THE ENTITY will inform the PRONABEC of these costs, for the purpose of holding the Annual Cost Addendum, attaching the legal disposition that establishes them and the decision of the internal government body of THE ENTITY that fixes administrative internal fees.

6.1.2. Grant the acceptance or admission letter to every Peruvian professional that meets all the admission requirements of THE ENTITY, including academic and language requirements, and is recommended for admission by the academic department. The letter must state a definitive, non-conditional offer and will include the following information:



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- I. Beginning and end date of the postgraduate studies program;
- II. Estimated total academic and administrative costs (may include health insurance fee specifying the coverage to be provided according to **Annex 5**).
- III. Merit-based order (rank among applicants)
- IV. Necessary English level duly accomplished.
- V. Inclusion of the student's health insurance policy (Public or granted by the entity)

6.1.3. Assist in facilitating the documentation needed to obtain the Student Visa for the entire length of the graduate program chosen by the student. THE ENTITY expressly states to know that scholarship holders must go back to their country to revert in their hometowns the acquired knowledge in order to accomplish the Peru Service Commitment. In that sense, THE ENTITY will not make any kind of offer to scholarship holders to work or to research in the United States after having finished their postgraduate studies.

6.1.4. Provide access to University services such as health, counseling, tutoring, and advising services in the same manner as provided to all other University graduate students.

6.1.5. Send to PRONABEC, at the end of each academic period, attached to the original invoice for registration of the next academic period, a complete report on the academic progress and disciplinary status of each scholarship holder based in:

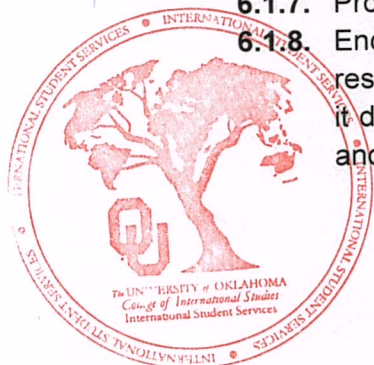
- Academic Report of the academic period concluded.
- Academic Report on the subsequent enrollment period beginning (list of enrolled subject)

Indicate if there are any pending study subjects and if there are failed subjects that must be retaken with the scholarship holder enrolling again but paying the cost. THE ENTITY will not bill PRONABEC, in the following academic period, for the subject(s) that scholarship holder needs to repeat until successfully approving them. In that order the scholarship holder will sign the authorization to release information indicated in Annex 3 of this agreement.

6.1.6. Provide to PRONABEC, permission to install in the institutional electronic portal of PRONABEC a direct link to the website of THE ENTITY in order to facilitate the access to the information concerning the official Master and Doctorate programs offered by THE ENTITY stated in Annex 1 of this agreement.

6.1.7. Provide room and board information and advice to scholarship holders.

6.1.8. Encourage and give the facilities for the scholarship holders to start their research and coursework from the beginning of their studies in order to have it done by the end of their academic program, in generally the same manner and to the same extent as other graduate students in the University.



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- 6.1.9. Facilitate well-equipped research space to the standard required for higher degree research students for each scholarship holder of PRONABEC in order to support the normal development of their research activities.
- 6.1.10. Not enroll in the next academic term any scholarship holder who did not meet the program's academic requirements (causing loss of the scholarship), obtain disapproval average in one semester or receive disciplinary sanction (suspension or expulsion) ordered by the University or others causals stated in THE ENTITY'S Academic Retention, Probation and Suspension Regulations, and immediately inform PRONABEC.
- 6.1.11. Communicate to PRONABEC any scholarship holder applying for change in his or her academic program and/or suspension of studies¹.

6.2. COMMITMENTS OF PRONABEC

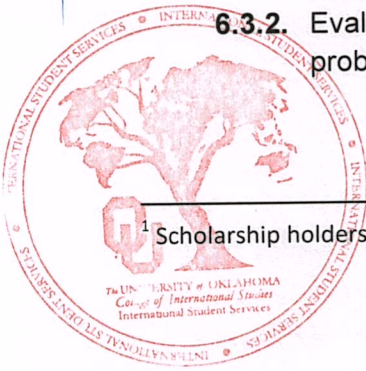
PRONABEC, commits to:

- 6.2.1. Cover the total tuition costs and fee costs of each Peruvian scholarship holder as indicated in 6.1.1, 6.1.5 and 6.1.6. The respective invoice will be paid via disposition of funds through the Integrated Financial Management System (SIAF in Spanish initials) of the Peruvian State to the bank account indicated by ENTITY. Cancellation shall take place within the time limits and procedures established by the parties in Annex 3 of this Agreement and subject to the PRONABEC's Rules for Execution of Subsidies abroad.
- 6.2.2. Grant the following subventions to PRONABEC's scholarship holders:
 - a. Annual stipend for living expenses.
 - b. Annual stipend for academic materials.
 - c. Roundtrip flight tickets to each scholarship holder; Lima - Oklahoma City, Oklahoma (at the beginning of the academic program) and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma – Lima (at the end of the academic program)
 - d. Cover the research work and degree certification costs and the rest of benefits indicated in number 1.3.2 ut supra.
 - e. Insurance with health, accident, life and repatriation coverage.

6.3 COMMON COMMITMENTS

- 6.3.1. Elaborate a joint work plan every year aiming to achieve the objectives of the commitments established in this agreement.
- 6.3.2. Evaluate and inform the results of the cooperation achieved, identifying the problems and the possible improvements in the execution of this agreement.

¹ Scholarship holders only can suspend postgraduate studies until one year. Change of Program is forbidden.



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SEVENTH: FINANCING

PRONABEC will cover the costs of the concepts indicated in numeral 6.2, except the repetition of failed courses, and THE ENTITY will assume the costs indicated in numeral 6.1 of the Sixth Article, with the objective that the Peruvian scholarship holders can access, stay and finish their studies in THE ENTITY and obtaining their degree or title. The financing corresponding to PRONABEC is granted according to the Budget assigned annually by the Public Budget Laws of the country and the Law N° 30281 – General Law of the National Budget System of Peru.

EIGHT: INTERINSTITUTIONAL COORDINATION

8.1. For the adequate follow up, supervision and monitoring in compliance of the commitments established in this agreement, the parties agree to assign as Interinstitutional Coordinators, according to the functions exercised in the implementation of this agreement, the following officials:

For PRONABEC

- Responsible : Executive Director of PRONABEC
- Alternative : Chief of the Graduate Scholarships Office of PRONABEC.

For THE ENTITY

- Responsible : Dean of the College of International Studies
- Alternative : Dean of the Graduate College

8.2. PRONABEC and THE ENTITY shall substitute their Interinstitutional coordinators when considered appropriate.

8.3. The substitution must take effect starting the seventh day after the reception of the letter of substitution given by the counterpart.

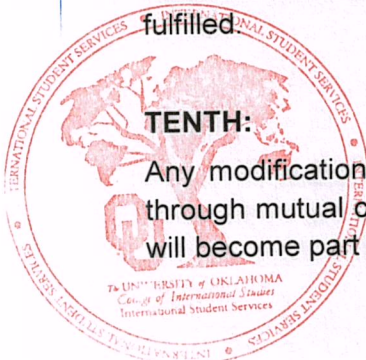
NINTH: LENGTH OF THE AGREEMENT VALIDATION

Unless terminated sooner as provided in Article Twelve and Article Thirteen herein, the length of validation of this agreement is 5 years, starting from the latter date of subscription with an option to extend by mutual exchange of letters.

When the agreement expires, the commitments assumed by THE PARTIES will remain in effect until the total compliance and execution of the current pending commitments are fulfilled

TENTH: AGREEMENT MODIFICATIONS

Any modifications, restrictions, broadening or extension of this agreement can be done through mutual consensus of THE PARTIES and must be formalized by Addendum which will become part of this agreement.



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ELEVENTH: SOLUTIONS TO CONTROVERSIES

Any controversies, discrepancies or demands derived from this agreement, including the ones concerning its expiration, nullity, execution, compliance or interpretation shall be settled by THE PARTIES through mutual consultation acting in good faith and in accordance to their common objectives.

TWELVETH: FINAL DISPOSITIONS

12.1. The parties subscribing to this agreement expressly agree to be subject to Peruvian law and the Laws of the State of Oklahoma - USA, and the agreements contained in this document that are law between the parties - and state that their respective residences are the addresses mentioned in the introduction to this document, to which each other will be sent valid communications and / or notifications as necessary. Any variation of these addresses will be effective on the tenth business day after being notified in writing to the other party.

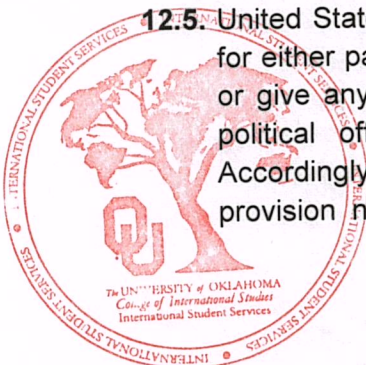
12.2. All communications shall be valid and effective if done in writing, sent and received via fax, institutional e-mail, certified mail or notarized communications, and remitted between those who subscribe this agreement and between Inter-Institutional Coordinators.

12.3. This Agreement may be terminated by either party. As such:

- a. The decision shall become effective from the conclusion of the current academic period when the decision is communicated.
- b. The resolution does not affect the activities and obligations that the parties are developing, in such academic period which should continue to be met until implementation is completed, as appropriate.
- c. They proceed to settle and pay the costs incurred by Pronabec until end of current academic period, according to the terms of this agreement.
- d. If scholarship holders do not deem appropriate changing to another university to complete their studies, the obligations will remain in force between the parties exclusively regarding these scholarship holders, not making new calls for scholarship competitions that aim to send new PRONABEC scholarship holders to THE ENTITY.
- e. The parties shall take the necessary measures to avoid or minimize any prejudice, both among themselves and the scholarship holders.

12.4. If either party breaches a material obligation under this Agreement, and such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days after such party's receipt of written notice of breach, the party not in default may immediately terminate this Agreement.

12.5. United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act.- Under United States Law, it is illegal for either party to this Agreement either directly or indirectly to offer, provide money, or give anything of value to any governmental official, employee, or candidate for political office for the purpose of influencing an official decision or action. Accordingly, the parties agree that neither will engage in the activity described in this provision nor otherwise violate the United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act.



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Should a party do so, the other may terminate this Agreement immediately and without notice.

In absolute conformity, the parties proceed to subscribe this agreement in two sets of 02 original copies each, one in Spanish and the other in English and both equal in content and authenticity.

- (f) Environmental Sciences and Technologies, Earth Sciences, Forestry Sciences;
- (g) Crop and food technologies;
- (h) Information and Communications Technologies;
- (i) Basic Sciences, physics, chemistry, mathematics, pharmacy and biochemistry;
- (j) Education;
- (k) Public Administration, Public Management, Public Policy and Economics (related to science and technologies)
- (l) Engineering (all specialties) oriented to: Aquaculture, agriculture, environmental, civil, marine science, electrical, electronics, nuclear energy, farming, geology, industrial, computer, food industries, mechanical, metallurgy, mining, materials, fishing, chemical, water resources, forestry, systems, technology, telecommunications, transportation, animal and husbandry
- (m) Architecture.

The studies outlined in paragraphs (b), (d), (j), (k) and (m) must not exceed 20% (twenty percent) of total scholarships to be awarded annually.

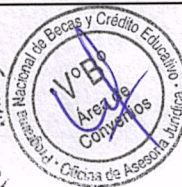
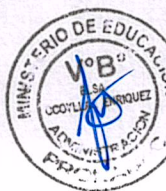
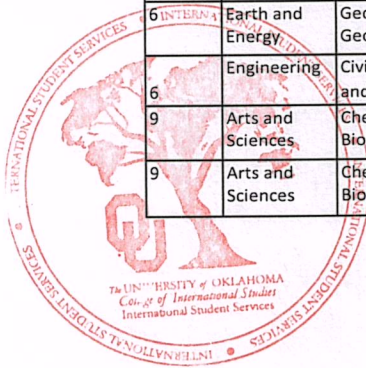
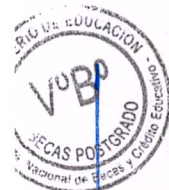

Who can enroll?

Undergraduate students: You must be enrolled for at least nine (9) credit hours during the fall or spring semesters or three (3) credit hours if you are enrolling for summer only coverage.

Graduate students: You must be enrolled for at least five (5) credit hours during the fall or spring semesters, three (3) credit hours if you are enrolling for summer only coverage, or two (2) thesis or dissertation credit hours.

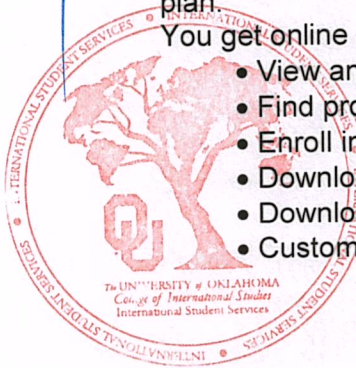
Disabled students: If you are enrolled as a full-time student, but you have a documented disability and have successfully petitioned the university for full-time status, you may be eligible to enroll in the plan.

Eligible students who enroll may also enroll their spouses and dependents. This plan is also available to the University of Oklahoma-Tulsa Schusterman Center Campus students (Social Work, Human Relations, Organizational Dynamics, Public Administration, Library&Information Sciences and Early Childhood Education).

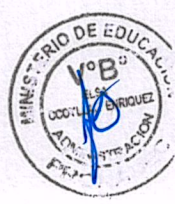

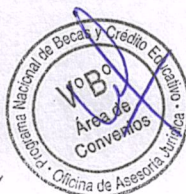
